

# WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS

## SANDPAPER TRANSFER POUCH

### Materials Needed:

- Canvas Pouch
- Sandpaper sheets (in pouch)
- Crayons
- Scissors
- Iron (Grown-up assistants)

1. Using crayons on sandpaper...color/create different designs.
2. You can cover the whole piece or create smaller designs and cut out.
3. Place your designs face-down onto the pouch (so you are looking at the back of the sandpaper).
4. On medium heat iron the back of sandpaper for a few seconds.
5. Once cooled, pull sandpaper up and see your design on the pouch.
6. Repeat with more designs on front and back of pouch.
7. If you write words, they will come out backwards, so as for a grown-up's help to write words backwards.
8. Use and enjoy!

## WATERCOLOR TIE-DYE WALL HANGINGS

### Materials Needed:

- Mini white cloths
- Jumbo popsicle sticks
- Watercolors
- Paint brush
- Clothespin
- Twine
- Sticky Rhinestones
- Cup of water
- Paper towels

### \*Fold Options - Two-Ways...Read Carefully:

1. Accordion-fold fabric rectangle long ways.
2. Accordion-fold the folded stripe into a triangle like you a making a paper football OR
3. Accordion-fold the folded stripe into a square.Use a clothespin to hold the folds together.
4. Dip folded fabric into a bowl of clean water until wet through.
5. Use fingers to pinch out excess water, maintaining the folded pattern.
6. Wet a paintbrush and load with watercolor paint.
7. Brush paint onto the folded edges of the fabric.
8. You may need to move the clothespin to reach all sides.
9. Once sides are painted, carefully unfold fabric and lay flat to dry.
10. Once fabric has dried, peel double-stick tape from popsicle sticks and attach the fabric.
11. Attach twine to the top popsicle stick.
12. Embellish popsicle sticks with sticky rhinestones and whatever you would like to use from home!

## CRAYON + WAX PAPER LANTERN

### Materials Needed:

- Crayons
- Crayon Sharpener
- 8 Wax Paper Squares
- 32 Glue Dots
- 16 Popsicle sticks
- Scissors
- Iron (Grown-up assistants)
- Faux Tea Light
- Masking tape
- Glue (optional)

1. Lay out 4 wax paper squares.
2. Use crayon sharpener to get different colored shavings of crayons to dump onto each piece of wax paper.
3. Once you get a few colors on each piece of paper, cover with the unused wax paper pieces.
4. With a low to medium heat iron and grown-up help, iron the papers.
5. Let cool.
6. In the meantime, use glue dots and popsicle sticks to create squares/frames for the wax paper.
7. Once wax paper is cool and popsicle frames are set up, use the rest of the glue dots (or tape or glue) to attach each wax paper to each frame.
8. Trim the edges of wax paper that is hanging over the frames.
9. Use sticky gems to decorate the front of the frames.
10. To attach the frames into a 3D cube, use masking tape down the edges to attach to each other.

12. Light your tea light and set in the center of your cube/lantern!

## OIL PASTEL + CRAYON RESIST PAINTING

### Materials Needed:

- White oil pastel
- Crayons
- Watercolor paper
- Canvas
- Watercolors
- Paint brush
- Cup of water
- Paper towels

### \*In this project, we are really experimenting with resist painting...oil and water do not mix, and wax and water don't either!

1. Use paper to practice and experiment (cut the paper into halves or quarters for more pieces)...we will use the canvas to make our final piece.
2. Let your dabbler draw abstractly if they would like. (I drew fruits, flowers and plants, but it is not necessary for them to do this)
3. Use your white oil pastel or crayons to color/draw on different pieces of watercolor paper to see the difference with crayons and pastel.
4. Once through your drawings, drench watercolor paint onto your paper, making sure to clean your brush between colors.
5. Experiment until you find combinations you like.
6. Once you come up with your plan, draw on your canvas and then paint!
