

Marker Tie-Dye Scarf

Materials Needed:

- White cloth/scarf
- Permanent markers
- Rubbing alcohol
- Pipette (Eye dropper)
- Big piece of cardboard to lay under cloth/scarf
- Iron (after design dries, to set color)

*when using rubbing alcohol, always work in a well-ventilated space

1. Lay your white cloth flat on top of a large piece of cardboard to prevent the markers from bleeding through to furniture.
2. Using your own imagination or the examples of patterns here, draw with the markers in circular patterns all over your cloth.
3. Leave white space within the patterns and around the patterns to allow for colors to bleed and spread.
4. When you are done designing, either spritz with spray bottle or use pipette to drip rubbing alcohol onto your designs.
5. Start off slowly...do not drench it, just spritz or drip one at a time and watch the magic of the colors spreading.
6. If you would like to add another spritz or drop after the colors stop bleeding, now is the time to do that.
7. Repeat until you have the "tie-dye" look/design that you like!
8. Once dry, ask a grown-up to help you iron your scarf to set your design.

Color-Splashed Wall Clock

Materials Needed:

- White clock (Plastic lid is already removed for you, set it aside)
- Permanent Markers
- Rubbing alcohol
- Pipette
- Pipe Cleaners

1. With a grown-ups help, remove the hands and battery pack of the clock.
2. Use your markers to create a design on the face (white part) of the clock, scribbles and doodles, etc.
3. After you have finished coloring the face, drip/spritz it with alcohol...do not add too much.
4. Watch the colors disperse and let dry.
5. After it settles, you can add more alcohol spritzes or drips to get your desired look.
6. Once it dries, get out your pipe cleaners.
7. The numbers on your clock are holes, and we are sewing our pipe cleaners in and out of them!
8. Pick one color for each number (two for the double-digits) and sew in and out (see instructional video for help).
9. Once you are done weaving the pipe cleaners through all of your numbers, you are done!
10. With a grown-up's help, reattach the hands, battery pack, and plastic top.
11. Add one AA battery and set your clock and hang!

Clay Succulents + Colorful Planters

Materials Needed:

- Model Magic clay packets
- Two white planters
- Permanent markers
- Toothpicks
- Assorted green paint
- Paintbrush
- Rubbing alcohol (optional)
- Crinkle cut paper from DabbleBox stuffing

*When modeling our succulents, it is extra helpful to watch our instructional videos with Cece and Emily...

1. Using your model magic and example pictures of succulents...we are going to create our own little plants.
2. Once done forming, stick a toothpick in the bottom and let it dry overnight.
3. While we are waiting for our succulents to dry, we can color our planters.
4. Using your permanent markers, design/color your planters .
5. If you would like, you are welcome to use a spritz of alcohol on your planter design.
6. Let your planters dry.
7. Once your succulents are dry (the next day), use assorted green paints to paint them. You can hold your toothpick for ease.
8. Let the paint dry.
9. Fill your planters with your DabbleBox crinkle paper stuffing.
10. Once your succulents are dry, place toothpick stem into crinkle paper in the planter and enjoy!

Fabric Weaving on Canvas

Materials Needed:

- Pre-slitted canvas
- Paper bag full of fabric strips
- Permanent Markers
- Rubbing alcohol

*Please watch Emily + Cece weave on instructional video, it is extremely helpful on this project.

1. On your pre-slit white canvas, gently add color with your permanent markers if you would like.
2. Spritz with rubbing alcohol to create a watercolor effect on your canvas.
3. Once you get the look you want on your canvas, let it dry.
4. Next step weaving...as a guide to beginner weaving, watch our instructional video.
5. We are creating a beautifully textured canvas and it is much better explained on video.
