WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS TO
FOLLOW ALONG WITH VIDEOS

Peace on Earth Plaque

Materials Needed:

- Wood Circle Plaque
- Blue + Green Washable Markers
- Spray Bottle with Water
- Paintbrush
- Foam Sheet
- Pencil and Scissors to Trace and Cut-Out your Hand
- Glue Stick
- Glitter Glue
- Foam Mount Stick-On

1. On your wood plaque, color scribbles/blobs/masses with your blue and green markers.
2. Get your spray bottle full of water and your paintbrush.
3. Spray water on your green and blue markings on the plaque to dilute turning into watercolor.
4. Move the watercolors around with your paintbrush to create the "world" or "earth"
5. Do this until your whole plaque is covered by blue and green and you are happy with how your world looks.
6. Once dry, add blue and green glitter glue to add dimension and sparkle.
7. Repeat on both sides after one side dries.
8. In the meantime, take your foam sheet to trace your hand.
9. Cut-out your hand from the foam.
10. Create a peace sign with the fingers by glueing the down the outside fingers.
11. Let all pieces dry and attach the peace sign hand to with foam stick-on to the earth.
12. On the other side of the Earth, using you gold glitter glue, draw a peace sign.
13. Let this side dry and Enjoy your "Peace on Earth"!

Paper Bag Snowflake/Star

Materials Needed:

- 9 White Paperbags
- Washable Markers
- Spray Bottle with Water
- Paintbrush
- Tin Foil Sheet
- Scissors
- Glue Stick
- Paper Towels

This project is really helpful to watch with the instructional video

1. Open your tin foil sheet and using your marker color different color "blobs" and markings on it in a section about the size of your paper bag.
2. Spritz water on the markings with your spray bottle and then move colors around with paintbrush.
3. Making sure the your colors are not too wet, stamp one side of your paper bag onto the colored foil.
4. Lift up and see how the colors transformed and create a watercolor design on one side of your bag
5. Wipe down tin foil between each bag so you can start from scratch.
6. Let dry and do this on the front side of each bag to cover all 9 bags.
7. Let all the front sides of the bags dry and then do this on the back side of each bag.
8. See patterns included in box to get ideas on how to cut your snowflake/star.
9. Cut multiple bags in chosen pattern at a time to create symmetry throughout your snowflake/star.
10. See diagram on where/how to glue stick your bags to each other.
11. Once all glued together including end-to-end, open and enjoy your masterpiece.

Winter Tree Scene

Materials Needed:

- Black Cardstock Canvas
- White Correction Pen
- Construction Paper Pieces
- Scissors
- Glue Stick
- Glitter Water Pen

1. Using construction paper pieces, cut out different size triangles.
2. This is easy to do if you fold a piece in half and then cut a straight line diagonally across.
3. Glue your triangles to your black board at different levels to create a landscape.
4. Using your white correction pen and your sheet of example tree doodles to add details and designs to your trees.
5. Add snow and snowflakes with your correction pen.
6. Let dry.
7. Follow directions on the Glitter Water Pen to get it going, and then add glittery accents to your picture.
8. The glitter pen looks really cool on the black background.
9. Let dry and hang!
10. If you have more black paper at home, you can make more of these!

Gingerbread House Gift Bags

Materials Needed:

- Brown Paper Bags
- White Correction Pen
- Glitter Water Pen
- Scotch Tape or Stapler to Seal the Bags

1. Fold top corners of your brown bag in to create a roof shape.
2. Similar to your winter scene, use your white correction pen to add design your house, see examples in your packet.
3. Let dry and use your glitter pen to add sparkle if you would like.
4. Use your bags to put presents in or just stuff and use as decoration.
5. Tape or staple the folded corner (roof) to seal shut.

Bleeding Tissue on Photo Paper

Materials Needed:

- Bleeding Tissue Paper Cuttings
- Photo Paper
- Scissors
- Spray Water Bottle
- Jingle Bells
- Glitter Foam Balls
- Cardboard Tube with Balloon Attached
- Glue Stick
- Scotch Tape and/or Stapler
- Paper Towels
- Tray or Surface to Work on

1. On you work surface, place a piece of photo paper.
2. Take your bleeding tissue paper, feel free to cut it into shapes or rip into random pieces.
3. Cover your photo paper in your tissue paper...you can leave some white space or fully cover.
4. Use your spray bottle to spritz water onto your design.
5. Start with a little spritz to keep the tissue paper in place, then spray to make sure you get all the tissue papers wet so the color bleeds.
6. If the water is pooling, you can blot it with a paper towel.
7. Let it dry, which should not take too long.
8. Once it is dry, the tissue papers should fall off.
9. If your design doesn't have enough color, or if you want to add more to it...you can, just put more tissue paper on and spritz again.
10. You have 4 pieces of photo paper in your box....make all 4.
11. For your popper, wrap one of your paper designs around your cardboard tube and use your glue stick (or scotch tape) to attach.
12. Put your glitter balls (you can also use pompoms) in the tube and pull the balloon end and let it go, and "POP"!
13. For your noisemaker, see instructional videos to see how to form.
